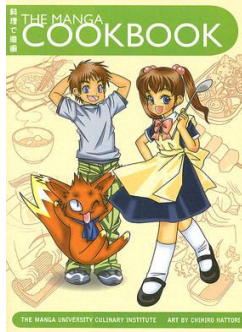
Schlosser, Eric. *Chew on This: Everything you didn't want to know about fast food.*
